### Fair Work Days

Workdays at the 4-H Fair Grounds this year will be **Friday, July 5 & July 12**, from 4:00 p.m. until all jobs are completed. All clubs are asked to work. **It is mandatory you be at 1 of the 2 pre-fair clean-ups before fair and the 1 following fair or premium money will be forfeited.**

#### 1<sup>st</sup> Work Day Inside Clean Kitchen

1. Vacuum out drawers and shelves.
2. Wash and wipe off counter tops.
3. Wipe down outsides of upper and base cabinets.
4. Wash metal kitchen doors – both sides.
5. Empty and scrub trash cans.
6. Clean sinks and range tops. You may want to bring rubber gloves and dust masks
7. Clean refrigerator and microwave oven.
8. BBQ Grills need to be cleaned!!
9. Sweep and mop kitchen floor.

#### Boys & Girls Bathrooms

1. Clean sinks and toilets.
2. Wash stalls and walls for dirt, foot prints, etc.
3. Put out toilet paper and check paper towels as needed.
4. Clean mirrors.
5. Wash bathroom doors and light switch plates.
6. Empty trash cans and put in liners or bags.
7. Clean & disinfect showers.
8. Spot clean cinder block walls in hall.
9. Wash water service door in bathroom hall.
10. Wipe down baby changing stations.

11. Sweep and mop bathroom floors

#### Clean large meeting room in building

1. Wash utility room and cinder block wall in large meeting room especially under concession stand window.
2. Empty trash into dumpster – put new trash bags in.
3. Clean in all corners and remove cobwebs. If you have cherry pickers, you might bring them to clean the overhead cobwebs and ceiling fans.
4. Shake front door mats. Sweep and mop floor.
5. Dust display cases and furniture with a dry rag. **No liquid cleaner or water** is to be used on new cabinets.
6. Get clothes racks and mannequins from storage building and dust.
7. Set up the 4-H Building in preparation for the fair.
8. Clean water fountain with stainless steel cleaner.

**Please bring cleaning supplies, screw drivers, screws, drills, hammers, buckets, hoes, ladders, weed eaters, large stapler's and cherry pickers, rakes & wheelbarrows, etc.**

### The 2<sup>nd</sup> work day will be held on Friday, July 12, at 4:00 p.m.

We will begin at 4:00 p.m.

Any cleaning which may need to be done again, check the bathrooms and large meeting room.

1. Work on outdoor lights and replace bulbs.
2. Place bleachers and livestock backdrop for pictures.
3. Clean water cooler and set up for use.
4. Empty trash and replace bags or liners.
5. Mow and weed eat.
6. Set up Rabbit Cages.
7. Set up Livestock Panels.
8. Trim trees if needed.
9. Flag clips ready on poles.
10. Sweep all sidewalks after weed eating and mowing.
11. Set up 2<sup>nd</sup> Building for additional project display

### Fair Board Meeting

Next **Fair Board** Meeting is Friday, July 12, 2024, after clean up at the Gove Co. 4-H Building, Grainfield.

Fair Board will hear any requests 4-H members may have to be absent from the food and livestock sales. This needs to be done in order for someone to take a 4-H member's place at the auctions and still receive the premium.

Gove County Fair Board will hear any request for 4-H Members who did not make the minimum attendance requirement.

Letter must be received by GCFB member seven days prior to the start of fair (July 8<sup>th</sup>)

# Clothing Project Judging

## Theme: "Where the West is Fun"

This year the judging will be held July 12, at 10:00 a.m. at St. Agnes Catholic Education Center, 289 Cedar Street, Grainfield, and Public Revue will be Wednesday, July 17<sup>th</sup> at 7 p.m. at the 4-H Building.

**Cost Per Wear Forms are required for ALL Fashion Revue divisions. Include a 4 x 6 picture of exhibitor in outfit & fabric swatch if constructed with entry.**

The Clothing Project judging has three major sections.

**First section:** Fashion Revue (Shopping in Style and Sewing & Textile Design categories) are for any 4-H member who wishes to purchase an outfit and model it. Those in the Fashion Revue contest, will appear only once before the judge wearing your outfits. **4 outfits** will be the limit, with one of those outfits having a "Shopping in Style" entry. You will need to fill out the top half of a Clothing and Textiles Presentation Evaluation Score Card prior to the judging. **You will need to bring to the judges table when you model.**

- **entry card**
  - **picture**
  - **scorecard & cost per wear form**
- There will **NOT** be call backs.

To be eligible for State Fair Fashion Revue you must be enrolled in Shopping in Style or Sewing & Textiles Designs, have been declared a winner at county level and must be 10-18 years of age, but not yet 19. Alternates may participate if winners cannot attend.

**Second section:** Shopping in Style (Buymanship) for any 4-H member enrolled in the project. This is new to Kansas 4-H for 2024 and includes poster/display boards based on age. A total of 4 entries per participant is allotted. Only 1 has to be included in your Fashion Revue totals. The other 3 can be of members choice. Due to our space availability, not all entries will be able to display in the fair building. State Fair eligible is purple ribbon and age 9-18 years old as of January 1, 2024.

**Third Section:** Sewing & Textile Designs. This is formerly known as Clothing Construction. The judge will inspect your sewing and alterations from complete patterns to recycled clothing garment. Participants can make pillows, aprons, bags, shirts, pants, etc. This category does NOT include quilted items. The quilted projects are to be judged along with Fiber Arts. Sewing & Textile Designs participants eligible for Kansas State Fair must receive a purple award or higher and be the 4-H age of 9 or older. Sr. level participants must choose between Fashion Revue or Sewing & Textile Designs for Kansas State Fair if they qualify for both in the same outfit. Contact Extension office for more details

We will have 4-H clubs serve BBQ meal. There will be time slots for prep, serving, and cleanup. Please sign up at Fair.

## 4-H Food Sale

The food sale will be Wednesday, July 17, during the Public Style Revue. **It is very important for each 4-Her to seek two buyers to come to the sale** in order to keep the prices up where you'd like to see them.

In order to be ready for the sale the first evening, we are asking each 4-H member to bring two flats or boxes (cakes and pies from the cake and pie contests and cookie jars not selected to sell at the livestock auction may be included in these flats.)

**Please bring flats on Wednesday morning for the food sale, with your name marked on them. It is highly recommended to decorate your flat.**

Guidelines for the sale will be as follows:

1. 4-H members must be present to sell unless you have petitioned the 4-H Fair Board for an excused absence.
2. 4-H members may sell only two flats or boxes of food he or she is enrolled in. **Recipes are required for all exhibits. Please include 2 – one for judge and one for Food Sale Buyer.**
3. 4-Her's should designate at the time of judging if they wish to sell their food. There will be a sign-up sheet at the Extension Desk while foods are being judged until 1 p.m.
4. A portion of the product will remain on display for the remainder of the fair.
5. If you are making cookies or cupcakes, you will need to bring an extra dozen or two to give your buyer something to buy. They need to get something for the money they are spending.

Entry cards will be printed at Extension Office and be available for pickup on the first day of fair. Cards will be sorted by Family. **Livestock cards will be kept by Extension until ribbons have been placed.** Families are strongly encouraged to look them over for any corrections to be made in advance of shows.

**Please place red mark on scratched entries & place back in family folder. Markers will be provided.**

**No Handwritten Cards will be accepted.** To keep our records straight, we can no longer accept hand written cards. Extension Staff advise you to register for any class that might come to fair for your family. We can sort out scratches during judging times.
