Style Revue Schedule (Judging)

Scripts are due Monday, July 13th, in the Extension Office.

For those of you who are enrolled in the buymanship or constructed fashion revue, you appear **in your outfit** before the judge one time only. You should have 1 entry card for per outfit. You will also need one 4-H Fashion Revue Evaluation Scorecard for each entry. This is available on the: http://www.goldenprairie.k-state.edu/4-h/gove-fair.html.

Bring this to the person lining you up to the judge with your entry card. Remember, you **DO** need pictures for the county judging. A picture of you in each outfit attached to the evaluation. You may model your garments in any order you choose. It will not make any difference.

Please note: The judging will be held at Extension Office Meeting Room, in Grainfield, on Tuesday, July 21, at 2:00 p.m., and the Public Style Revue will be at the 4-H Building on Wednesday, July 22, at 7:00 p.m. Good Luck to all of you!!

Remember – we have two judges this year so you need to be at the judging early & be ready to go by 2:00 p.m.

Style Revue Participants

For all those who are enrolled in Clothing Construction, you will need to bring the following to the fair:

- Your constructed and/or buymanship projects.
- Your fashion revue score card for each constructed outfit.
- Your fashion revue score cards for each buymanship outfit.
- 4. 4 x 6 picture of you in the outfit.

Open Class - For those of you who participate but are not enrolled, the display at the fair is optional. You may bring your outfits if you would like to.

Ideas for Questions

Following is a list of possible clothing construction and style revue questions you might be asked during a conference evaluation. Try not to answer with only a "yes" or "no" answer. Of course, there will probably not be time for all of them.

- 1. Why did you select these colors?
- 2. What kind of care will the garment(s) need?
- 3. What is the fiber content?
- 4. Why did you take this project?
- 5. How much experience did you have before you started this project?
- 6. What did you like most about the project?
- 7. What did you like least about the project?
- 8. What did you do the first time in this project?
- 9. Where did you get help?
- 10. What new things did you learn?
- 11. How will you use what you have learned?
- 12. What would you like to learn next?
- 13. If you were to do the project again, would you do anything differently? How do you feel

- your project could be improved?
- 14. How does this garment fit in with the other garments in your wardrobe?
- 15. Where do you plan to wear this garment?
- 16. What accessories are you planning or what accessories do you already have to wear with this garment?
- 17. What do you think you ribbon placing should be?

Herdsmanship Award

This year one belt buckle will be given out for overall herdsman.
There will be a grand champion of each species: beef, sheep, swine, goat, and horse. They will receive grand champion prize.

A few things that the judge will be looking for are:

- 1. Proper care and feeding of animals.
- Exhibitor conduct (your attitude and behavior in and around the barn, willingness to help others, politeness, no foul language, etc.)
- 3. Proper stall and pen Identification
- 4. Cleanliness of animals, alleys and stalls
- 5. Safety of animals, use of equipment in a safe manner and safety of other exhibitors.
- Presentation of your area: arrangement, cleanliness, organization of equipment, colorful (decorate your area if you wish)

**If you choose to decorate your area, I would encourage you to make sure that it is a positive reflection of 4-H, possibly relates to the fair theme and/or promotes the species that you are exhibiting.
**Judging for Herdsmanship will end on Thursday, July 23, at Noon.

Ag Challenge of Champions July 20-21, 2020 9 a.m. – 8 p.m.

- 1. All 4-Hers are eligible to participate. There will be a Jr., Int., & Sr. Division
- 2. County Extension Staff in cooperation with the Fair Board will be in charge of the contest. They shall have the authority for the interpretation of the policies.
- The contestants will be furnished with placing cards and any other necessary forms. No contestant will be allowed to have books, notes, or pamphlets during the contest.
- While contest is in session there shall be NO COMMUNICATION among contestants or anyone other than the group leader.
- 5. The overall individual ranking shall be determined by the total of each contestants points earned from the contest.

Format of Contest: any of the following

- 1. Written Test concerning total agricultural/ livestock industry.
- 2. Identification of pieces of livestock equipment.
- 3. Identification of breeds of beef cattle, dairy cattle, sheep, hogs, goats, and horses.
- 4. Identification of concentrates and/or roughages.
- 5. Identification of retail cuts of meat.
- Identification of common crops (either plant or seed).
- 7. Identification of common weeds (plant only)
- 8. Identification of common agronomic items including deficiency symptoms, fertilizers, inoculants, ag lime, soil probes, etc...
- 9. Written test with questions on farm equipment
- 10. Written test with questions on farm management
- 11. Written test with questions on general agriculture.
- 12. Ag Mechanics Identification of tractor parts.
