



Hazardous Occupations Safety Training in Agriculture - 2020

Online Training

Or by Mail Correspondence

Step 1: Register Call your Local Extension Office notifying that you will be completing the training. Staff will register you.

Step 2A: Study Staff will direct you to visit:

Step 2B: Study If you do not have internet access, Staff will send you the materials via mail – this is only available upon request.

Step 3: Take the Test After one week of studying and reviewing the materials, Staff will mail you the test.

Step 4: Turn in the Test Scan, take a photo, or mail the test back to Staff for grading.

Step 5: Practice Safety Staff will mail the Driving Test Evaluation and Skills Test Evaluation to be completed by your parent or employer.

Step 6: Turn in Evaluations Scan, take a photo, or mail the Driving Test Evaluation and Skills Test Evaluation back to Staff.

Step 7: Certification Upon successful completion of the above, Staff will mail or email your Certificate

This program will provide the trainee with the knowledge and information of tractor safety and farm hazards. A safety training is required by the U.S. Department of Labor for youth ages 14-15 who will be working on a farm for someone other than their parents. However, there are many cases where youth need certification even when working on the “family farm”. Certification will be presented to participants who meet all of the following:

- Complete all assignments
- Successfully complete a tractor safety exam
- Safely demonstrate the ability to operate a tractor and all its controls according to safe operating procedures under the supervision of a parent or employer
- Youth ages 14-15 years (others will receive certification at the time they turn 14)
